Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time
February 14TH

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today we conclude the Sundays of Ordinary Time and will begin the Liturgical Season of Lent this week with Ash Wednesday. We continue to follow the life of Jesus as we journey with Him up to Jerusalem, where He will arrive at Calvary and mount the cross. Ash Wednesday is a day of universal fast and abstinence in the Church. It is strongly recommended that the tradition of gathering the local Church for the devotion of this Season. Lent runs from Ash Wednesday until the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, April 1st. The ashes we receive symbolize our mortality and our repentance. Ash Wednesday is a day which we publicly and simply profess that we are Catholic Christians and that we belong to Christ. The ash is a symbol of our sinful nature. When we receive the ash, we are invited to change our lives, to fill our hearts with the Word of God and if we are far from Him and our faith, we must return to Christ and His Church. Catholics are encouraged to participate in the Eucharistic Liturgy and in the Sacrament of Penance during Lent and parishes are encouraged to provide regular and frequent opportunities for such participation. Likewise encouraged are devotions such as Stations of the Cross, vigils and prayer services with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, all of which we do at Saint Joseph. Traditional practices including increase of prayer, Scripture and other spiritual reading, giving of alms, personal self-denial in food and drink, increased care and service of the sick and needy. Abstaining from eating meat is to be observed on all Fridays during Lent. This applies to all persons 14 years and older. Fasting means that one full meatless meal, may be eaten. Two other meatless meals may be eaten, sufficient to maintain strength, but together they should not equal a full meal. Liquids, including milk and fruit juice, may be taken between meals. If health or ability to work is affected, fasting is not required. The law of fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday applies to all persons between the ages of 18 years and 59 years. Private, self-imposed, observance of fasting on Lenten weekdays are strongly recommended. Pastors and parents should ensure that children, who are not bound by the laws of fasting and abstinence, are taught an authentic sense of penance, conversion and reconciliation. The theme word for Lent is *Compunction*. It is related to the verb "to puncture" and suggests the deflation of our inflated egos. It is a challenge to see any self-deceit about the quality of our lives as disciples of Jesus. It is to be hit again and again with the demands of the gospel that we fail to live up to. The gospels are meant to trouble us so that we may confront our illusions about ourselves. Through *Compunction* we are lead to do *penance* and to *conversion*. *Penance* is our first steps of living a new life away from sin; it is the act of purifying one's self through prayer, sacrifice, and charitable deeds. This leads us to *Conversion*, which is a turn towards God. I hope this article introducing Lent is enough to get you started. May the peace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all.

Sixto Domingo de Tiempo Ordinario,
14 de Febrero

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas,

Hoy concluimos los domingos del tiempo ordinario y comenzaremos esta semana el Litúrgico del Tiempo de Cuaresma con el Miércoles de Ceniza. Seguimos la vida de Jesús mientras viajamos con Él hasta Jerusalén, donde llegará al Calvario y subirá a la cruz. El Miércoles de Ceniza es un día de ayuno universal y abstinencia en la Iglesia. Se recomienda encarecidamente la tradición de reunir a la Iglesia local para la devoción de esta época. La Cuaresma se extiende desde el Miércoles de Ceniza hasta la Misa de la Cena del Señor el Jueves Santo, Abril 1. Las cenizas que recibimos simbolizan nuestra mortalidad y nuestro arrepentimiento. El Miércoles de Ceniza es un día que profesamos pública y sencillamente que somos cristianos católicos y que pertenecemos a Cristo. La ceniza es un símbolo de nuestra naturaleza pecaminosa. Cuando recibimos la ceniza, estamos invitados a cambiar nuestras vidas, para llenar nuestros corazones con la Palabra de Dios y si estamos lejos de Él y nuestra fe, debemos regresar a Cristo y a Su Iglesia. Se alienta a los católicos a participar en la liturgia eucarística y en el sacramento de la penitencia durante la Cuaresma y se alienta a las parroquias a proporcionar oportunidades regulares y frecuentes para dicha participación. Igualmente se animan las devociones como Estaciones de la Cruz, vigiliyas y servicios de oración con la Bendición del Santísimo Sacramento, todo lo que hacemos en San José. Prácticas tradicionales que incluyen aumento de la oración, Escritura y otras lecturas espirituales, hacer obras de caridad, abnegación personal en alimentos y bebidas, mayor atención y servicio de los enfermos y necesitados. La abstención de comer carne se observará todos los viernes durante la Cuaresma. Esto se aplica a todas las personas mayores de 14 años. El ayuno significa que una comida completa sin carne puede ser comido. Otras dos comidas sin carne se pueden comer, suficiente para mantener la fuerza, pero juntos no deben ser iguales a una comida completa. Líquidos incluyendo leche y jugo de fruta, puede tomarse entre comidas. Si la salud o la capacidad de trabajo se ven afectadas, no es necesario ayunar. La ley de ayuno el Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo se aplica a todas las personas entre las edades de 18 años y 59 años. Se recomienda encarecidamente la observancia privada y autoimpuesta del ayuno en los días de semana de Cuaresma. Los pastores y los padres deben asegurarse de que los niños, que no están obligados por las leyes del ayuno y la abstinencia, se les enseña un auténtico sentido de penitencia, conversión y reconciliación. La palabra temática de Cuaresma es *Compunción*. Está relacionado con el verbo de "perforar" y sugiere la deflación de nuestros egos inflados. Es un desafío ver cualquier auto-engaño sobre la calidad de nuestra vida como discípulos de Jesús. Es ser golpeado una y otra vez con las exigencias del Evangelio que no cumplimos. Los evangelios están destinados a molestarnos para que podamos enfrentar nuestras ilusiones sobre nosotros mismos. A través de la Compunción nos llevamos a hacer penitencia y a conversión. La penitencia es nuestro primer paso para vivir una nueva vida lejos del pecado; es el acto de purificar uno mismo a través de la oración, el sacrificio, y obras de caridad. Espero que este artículo de introducción de la Cuaresma sea suficiente para empezar. Que la paz de nuestro Señor Jesucristo esté con todos ustedes.

YEAR OF SAINT JOSEPH



A beloved father

The greatness of Saint Joseph is that he was the spouse of Mary and the father of Jesus. In this way, he placed himself, in the words of Saint John Chrysostom, "at the service of the entire plan of salvation".^[7]

[Saint Paul VI](#) pointed out that Joseph concretely expressed his fatherhood "by making his life a sacrificial service to the mystery of the incarnation and its redemptive purpose. He employed his legal authority over the Holy Family to devote himself completely to them in his life and work. He turned his human vocation to domestic love into a superhuman oblation of himself, his heart and all his abilities, a love placed at the service of the Messiah who was growing to maturity in his home".^[8]

Thanks to his role in salvation history, Saint Joseph has always been venerated as a father by the Christian people. This is shown by the countless churches dedicated to him worldwide, the numerous religious Institutes, Confraternities and ecclesial groups inspired by his spirituality and bearing his name, and the many traditional expressions of piety in his honour. Innumerable holy men and women were passionately devoted to him. Among them was Teresa of Avila, who chose him as her advocate and intercessor, had frequent recourse to him and received whatever graces she asked of him. Encouraged by her own experience, Teresa persuaded others to cultivate devotion to Joseph.^[9]

Every prayer book contains prayers to Saint Joseph. Special prayers are offered to him each Wednesday and especially during the month of March, which is traditionally dedicated to him.^[10]



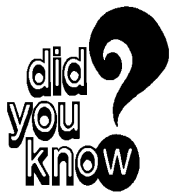
1. *Padre amado*

La grandeza de san José consiste en el hecho de que fue el esposo de María y el padre de Jesús. En cuanto tal, «entró en el servicio de toda la economía de la encarnación», como dice san Juan Crisóstomo^[7].

San Pablo VI observa que su paternidad se manifestó concretamente «al haber hecho de su vida un servicio, un sacrificio al misterio de la Encarnación y a la misión redentora que le está unida; al haber utilizado la autoridad legal, que le correspondía en la Sagrada Familia, para hacer de ella un don total de sí mismo, de su vida, de su trabajo; al haber convertido su vocación humana de amor doméstico en la oblación sobrehumana de sí mismo, de su corazón y de toda capacidad en el amor puesto al servicio del Mesías nacido en su casa»^[8].

Por su papel en la historia de la salvación, san José es un padre que siempre ha sido amado por el pueblo cristiano, como lo demuestra el hecho de que se le han dedicado numerosas iglesias en todo el mundo; que muchos institutos religiosos, hermandades y grupos eclesiales se inspiran en su espiritualidad y llevan su nombre; y que desde hace siglos se celebran en su honor diversas representaciones sagradas. Muchos santos y santas le tuvieron una gran devoción, entre ellos Teresa de Avila, quien lo tomó como abogado e intercesor, encomendándose mucho a él y recibiendo todas las gracias que le pedía. Alentada por su experiencia, la santa persuadía a otros para que le fueran devotos^[9].

En todos los libros de oraciones se encuentra alguna oración a san José. Invocaciones particulares que le son dirigidas todos los miércoles y especialmente durante todo el mes de marzo, tradicionalmente dedicado a él^[10].

Asegúrese de que su hijo o hija adolescente tenga claro cómo manejarse en situaciones difíciles y que tenga una “salida” si necesita apoyarse en usted o en otro adulto de confianza. La honestidad y la especificidad harán que estas conversaciones tengan más impacto y que sea más probable que queden grabadas en la mente de su hijo adolescente.
